

LOG-IN to register for programs online by visiting Manheim Township's website at www.manheimtownship.org. Information on accessing this service will be available by clicking the "Departments" tab. Choose "Recreation", then "On Line Enrollment Page". The on-line registration link is in blue midway down the page. Once you have opened the on-line registration link, follow the command prompts. You may log-in as a **Guest** to view the activities, but you must have an account created to enroll. If you have registered with us before for programs, passes, or a Township ID card, you will be recognized as already being in the system when you create your account and will be prompted to contact the Recreation & Park Planning Office for your initial activation password. If you are a new customer, enter all information requested, then submit and you will be notified (via e-mail) with your initial activation password.

FEE STRUCTURE: Resident Fee [R] is listed with each program. Non-Resident fee [NR] is listed with programs open to both residents and non-residents. Non-Resident fee applies regardless of the fact a participant's business may be located within the Township. Senior Citizens Discount [SR] for Manheim Township Residents age 60 and over is listed with each program where applicable. Non-Resident Senior Citizens may pay regular Resident fee [R].

MAKE CHECK PAYABLE TO: Manheim Township Recreation & Park Planning Department. Please include your telephone and program number on front of check. A \$30 charge will be assessed for all checks returned by the bank.

REGISTRATION WILL BE ACCEPTED at the Recreation & Park Planning Office (Stauffer Mansion) ONLY, not at program sites.

CONFIRMATION of registration is sent only if requested (via e-mail or include a self-addressed stamped envelope with your mail-in registration).

WAIT LIST: Participants who register for an activity where capacity enrollment has been reached will go on a waiting list. Additional classes may be formed if there are sufficient requests and if facilities and instructors are available.

REFUNDS for Recreation Programs are issued only if requested prior to the second meeting of the class. *There is a \$5 service charge on each refund processed.* No refunds given on bus charter trip registrations unless replacement person can be obtained from our waiting list.



Call for Volunteers

Project FeederWatch, a citizen science project run by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology, is a winter-long survey of birds that visit feeders at backyards, nature centers, community areas, and other locales in North America. FeederWatchers periodically count the birds they see at their feeders from November through early April and send their counts to Project FeederWatch. FeederWatch data help scientists track broadscale movements of winter bird populations and long-term trends in bird distribution and abundance. Data also shows timing and extent of winter irruptions of winter finches and other species, expansions or contractions in the winter ranges of feeder birds, the kinds of foods and environmental factors that attract birds, and how disease is spread among birds that visit feeders.

We are looking for volunteers to help count feeder birds at the Boettcher House at Landis Woods. Anyone interested in birds can participate. Individuals with all skill levels and backgrounds are welcome. You will just choose an hour time slot on Tuesdays or Wednesdays. It's never too early to start planning for your finished basement building project in a single-family home or a townhouse. A building permit and a certificate of use and occupancy are required. If your basement is modified or finished without the required approvals, problems could arise when the house is sold.


Manheim Township Ordinance 2005-6 requires building permits be obtained to finish, alter or renovate an existing basement area. Proper planning and a complete permit application submittal can help eliminate unnecessary schedule delays and costs. Permit submittals include: construction floor plans and cross sections, specifications and the completed permit application form. A site plan may also be required by the Planning and Zoning Department for a window well and/or "Bilco" stair addition(s). A "Finished Basement Permit Submittal Guide" is available through the Code Compliance Department located at 1840 Municipal Drive, or on the Township website, www.manheimtownship.org under Departments click on Code Compliance, then Submittal Guides.

Security Alarm Systems

Security alarm systems in Manheim Township are regulated by ordinance, both for businesses and residences. A permit is required. You can apply for a permit at the Police Department Monday through Friday from 7:30 AM until 4 PM. **Permits are \$40 and are good for three years.**

Just a friendly reminder to all residents to keep snow cleared away from fire hydrants. By keeping fire hydrants clear of



snow and keeping them visible to us you make our jobs easier during an emergency. Access to fire hydrants is critical – please take the time to clear snow and ice away from any fire hydrants on your property. This will reduce the time it takes us

to access water during a fire situation.



COLD WEATHER IS HERE. ARE YOU PREPARED?



On average, more than one-third of residential fire deaths in the United States occur during the winter months. Heating equipment fires are the second leading causes of fire deaths in homes and the biggest fire culprit from November through March.

The four major causes of residential heating fires are:

- Lack of maintenance of heating equipment
- Lack of regular cleaning of chimneys, fireplaces and wood stoves
- Placing things that can burn too close to space and portable heaters
- Leaving portable or space heaters unattended.

Manheim Township Fire Rescue recommends taking these simple safety precautions that could help prevent a fire from starting in your home:

- Have a preventative maintenance check of your home heating system completed by your local service provider
- Have your chimneys, fireplaces and wood stoves inspected and cleaned
- Remember to keep space and portable heaters a minimum of 36 inches (yardstick) away from any combustible material.
- Never leave a portable or space heater unattended.





