Next Step Computer Boot Camp

Attendees of these classes should be familiar with concepts/vocabulary taught in BASICS computer classes and have fair typing and mouse skills. Laptops are available, but students may bring their own. A USB drive is required. Classes cost \$15.00 per class or \$50.00 for 4 classes and a 1 GB USB drive.

Topics included in this series:

Monday & Tuesday (computer): Gain knowledge of computer content, text boxes, menus, keyboard shortcuts, and learn how to personalize your computer. The class will download and save files, update software and explore computer's system info.

Wednesday (Word 2010): Additional functions of Word demonstrated including default personalizing, file organization/creation, template utilization and formatting of envelopes and labels.

Thursday (Internet): The class will work with web browsers, search engines, internet and website navigational tools. Bookmarking files and links to internet information will be created. Demos on web page design and browser personalization, too.

Friday (extra class cost \$15.00): Class will be a culmination of all previous lessons. Class will create and send an e-mail to instructor, which will include an attached document from a file saved on a USB drive and a link to a webpage. Space is limited to six students.
