- We asked our Solicitor to weigh in on the Executive session request (email below). The Advisory Committees in their formation within the Ordinance indicated they will be open to the public, however the Solicitor advises you can go into executive session at the end of the meeting due to the topic possibly “jeopardizing public safety preparedness”. The executive session should be on the agenda. I would advise that you come out of executive session at the end of executive session for only a moment to have the Chair declare the meeting adjourned. The minutes should not cover the executive session, but should reflect the adjournment time after coming out of executive session. You should go to another meeting room in the Library for the executive session, so you do not have to ask the public to leave, as that can be awkward. We could break the room up into two smaller meeting rooms. The Solicitor indicates that the Chair should announce in the open meeting just before entering into executive session, “that the committee is retiring into executive session to review use of force policies that if discussed in public could jeopardize public safety or preparedness”. There should not be votes taken in executive session. He advises also that any recommendations the committee may make related to use of force policies should be considered and approved at a public meeting.
